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As of 12/31/14 consolidated revenues for year to date (6 months ending 12/31/14) was \$3,652,279 which is \$462,295 less than a year ago on 12/31/13. Consolidated profit and loss statement for year to date (6 months ending 12/31/14) shows a consolidated net income of \$59,655 as compared to a net loss of (\$79,905) a year ago on 12/31/13 an increase of \$139,560 as compared to year ago. GLAD's net (loss) was (\$74,838), DAHC's net (loss) was (\$10,837), LifeSigns' net income was \$145,329, consolidated net income was \$59,655.

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IV. CEO'S REPORT

CEO is working with the coalition on various issues mostly on Education for the deaf children in the State and serves on some national coalitions in regards to VRS, VRI, and VRS for individuals who are deaf and blind.

- 30 As for the organization, CEO is pleased to have a new PR Director named Elizabeth Luttrell who used to
- 31 work as our PR Coordinator. Our mutual goal is to revamp our website to keep it clean and simple as well
- as easy to navigate. CEO is in talks with a foundation that will match funds to develop a new website. The negotiation should be done end of this week.
- 34 CEO's biggest concern is that not enough qualified candidates are applying for various job openings.
- 35 GLAD is using different social media tools to not much success. GLAD is still exploring different ways to get openings out to as many outlets as GLAD can.
- 37 GLAD's Holiday gathering for children on December 13th was a big success with many children leaving
- with full smiles. There were 240 participants. GLAD will continue doing this next year.
- 39 The following months January through March or so are usually focused on legislative activities; however,
- 40 CEO will work with the organization till we fill some key positions.
- 41 Former Board President and member Stephen Schultz's celebration of life was successfully held here at
- our auditorium. His family expressed a deep gratitude to GLAD for hosting the event. His family and his
- 43 friends made some financial donations to GLAD, too.
- 44 LIFESIGNS
- 45 LIFESIGNS will participate in a mixer hosted by Riverside Chamber of Commerce tomorrow to promote
- LS in the Riverside area and recruit potential vendors to use our services as the stats show that the request
- 47 from Riverside has decreased slightly year by year. Riverside has one of the largest deaf community and
- we need to retain contracts there to provide the highest quality interpreting services.
- 49 LIFESIGNS Board met and discussed the concept of launching "protégé" program which will have top
- 50 students from interpreting programs to shadow LS staff and free-lance interpreters to gain experience and

- 1 encourage them to get certificates by Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (RID) and by then they will be
- 2 ready to accept assignments from LifeSigns.
- 3 During the month of December
- 4 Filled Requests: 1302 5 Cancellations: 444 6 No Interpreter Available: 75
- 7 BUILDING
- 8 Our Building Manager worked on the front door to make the lock work again as its lock was disconnected
- 9 from the door.
- 10 The building manager painted several offices and the platform in the auditorium. He also worked on many
- small items such as replacing cracked glass on a window, repairing some leaking problems from heavy
- rain, several clogged drains on the 3rd floor due to stuffed rice and clogged oil, and misc.
- 13 HUMAN RESOURCES
- 14 As of today, we have 71 employees. There are 8 job openings.
- 15 HEALTH EDUCATION/SERVICES
- 16 GLAD submitted a full application to the Disability Communication Fund for a distance learning program;
- however, we did not get the grant due to too many applicants for a small funded program. GLAD will try
- again with other foundations.
- 19 The month was actually slow due to holidays and unable to schedule workshops at schools. It gave the
- staff an opportunity to work on projects that would start in 2015 like setting up workshops with schools
- 21 and organizations for presentations.
- 22 At least 80 individuals attended GLAD's World Aids Day event on December 3rd. The event was
- 23 successful because we had a HIV guest speaker talking about his experience. The audience asked good
- 24 questions and it was an excellent interactive presentation. GLAD also had eight panels of AIDS quilts
- 25 rented from the Quilt Aids Memorial displayed in the auditorium. During the event the guests could pick
- 26 up different HIV prevention informational materials and talked with different vendors at the booths.
- 27 GLAD was awarded a gift from a foundation for our core support and it would be used to support the
- 28 health case management program.
- 29 HUMAN SERVICES
- 30 *EDD*
- A total of 21 placements were made during the month of December. As for the fiscal year since July 2014,
- a total of 171 placements were made. There are always many obstacles in getting consumers into job
- interviews due to many factors. I applaud our employees for their hard work and dedication in getting our
- 34 consumers placed.
- 35 EDD staff also made presentations on Deaf Sensitivity to various employers and had booths at various job
- 36 fairs.
- 37 It has been challenging because there are two Job Developers/Interpreters positions that have been vacant
- for months. In the past, these positions had been easy to fill but not for some months. GLAD HR manager
- 39 is using more social media outlets to get information out. For these vacancies, these offices are using free-
- 40 lance interpreters for job interviews and orientations which impose another challenge because it could not
- 41 be predicted when consumers are invited for interviews. The EDD Manager is doing a great job shifting
- staff by location to work with each other to give each office support.
- 43 DSS Services
- 44 A total of 183 appointments were accomplished between LA and BGLAD during the month of December.
- Both offices noticed that the stats for VP appointments have been increasing month by month. For
- example, during December, there were 54 VP appointments which mean consumers convened with their
- 47 advocates using VP due to distance, lack of public transportation, lack of childcare, or lack of gas money.
- 48 Trends have been consistent like requesting for documentation translation on SSI notices; requests for
- 49 interpreters at their medical appointment and court hearings; how to find an apartment within reasonable
- 50 cost (part of independent living); advocacy on getting refunds from events that were not clear; and getting

- 1 attorneys for different issues.
- 2 BGLAD will be hosting No Ordinary Hero, the SuperDeafy Movie on February 12 at 630 pm. Tickets
- 3 were sold out and the request was made to move to a bigger theatre. BGLAD staff is waiting to hear back
- 4 if the request could be accommodated.
- 5 DAHC
- 6 There was a death on 3rd floor due to unknown causes, mostly possible due to natural causes.
- 7 DAHC/GLAD will host a celebration of life for the deceased tenant in February to remember her by.
- 8 Meanwhile the vacant apartment is being remodeled like getting a new carpet, a fresh paint all over the
- 9 apartment including bathroom, and a complete professional cleaning throughout the apartment to make it
- 10 comfortable for the next resident. CEO met with residents twice to discuss the death. CEO also offered to
- get counselors who specialize in grief and no requests were made. CEO met with the tenant's next kin and
- 12 had a nice talk about her aunt.

- 15 LIFESIGNS Chair Report:
- 16 Bowman reported that the LifeSigns board has two new deaf board members, Ellen Davidson and Sam
- 17 Domeonio.
- In an effort to recruit more freelance interpreters in the Antelope Valley, LifeSigns is looking for a location
- 19 to host a workshop due to the lack of interpreters in that area. The board would like to host three to four
- workshops for 2015.

- Gomez stated that she attended CODIE's Children's Holiday party and had a wonderful time. The event
- was very successful.

- 30 Sidansky reported that Tri GLAD hosted a successful Children's Holiday Party. More than 200 people
- 31 attended.
- 32 Tri GLAD will have a booth at the Strawberry Festival in May.
- 33 A board member would like to host different events for Tri GLAD, starting with a fundraiser at a local
- 34 restaurant.
- 35 Sidansky informed the board that Tri GLAD Board Member Patti Longo recently passed away. She will
- be greatly missed. Longo was a hard worker.

- Jones reported that there was a tax workshop on January 27, 2015. Every Wednesday at OCDEAF there is
- a deaf coffee social. Every third Thursday of every month OCDEAF hosts a deaf social at Shakey's and
- 41 every third Friday of the month OCDEAF hosts a deaf social at Starbucks as well.
