Financial report as of 9/30/14 was given to the board by Hughes with the following information. As of 9/30/14 consolidated revenues for year to date (3 months ending 9/30/14) was 1,697,277 which is 63,749 less than a year ago on 9/30/13. Consolidated profit and loss statement for year to date (3 months ending 9/30/14) shows a consolidated net loss of (18,107) as compared to a net income of 12,791 a year ago on 9/30/13. GLAD's net (loss) was (44,605), DAHC's net (loss) was (7,357), LifeSigns' net income was 33,856, consolidated net loss (18,107).

IV. CEO'S REPORT

Hughes reported that the organization has been doing good and yet kept very busy with consumers and providing services in different areas.

- Last July LifeSigns (LS) started providing interpreting services for the California Department of
- 26 Rehabilitation and Corrections (CDCR) on a statewide basis. LS subcontracts with sister agencies that
- 27 have Interpreter Referral Services and some private agencies/interpreters. It is too early to say what the
- 28 average of requests per month is. For example, in July, LS got 58 requests, August 39 and for
- 29 September, the request was 99. The number of CDCR requests represents a 4% of the total LS requests.
- The statistics of LS for the month of September is:

- 35 The accounts receivable project is ongoing as the amount has gone high due to a possible glitch in the
- QuickBooks between the "current" and the "1-30" days. Our accountant is working on this with the
- QuickBooks representative to look into it. For example, between today and 30 days, the amount is double
- 38 when it should be half the amount. However, the entire accounts receivable project is one of my highest
- 39 priorities to correct immediately with the director of LS.
- 40 HUMAN RESOURCES
- 41 GLAD has 70 employees as of October 22. There are seven openings which are also posted on our
- 42 websites. They are:
- 43 Legal Advocate, Placement Coordinator West Covina, Staff Interpreters (Los Angeles and Riverside);
- 44 Job Developer/Interpreters (Pacoima and West Covina).
- 45 HEALTH EDUCATION
- 46 GLAD submitted two proposals and/or Letter of Intent. One foundation will be doing a site visit in
- 47 November. Another foundation will notify us in the near future if they will invite us to submit a full
- 48 application. GLAD also got invited by another foundation to submit a full proposal.
- 49 Our funding from a foundation was exhausted September; however, we manage to keep Case Management
- 50 program operating under another foundation. We look forward to the possibility of getting another gift

- 1 from a foundation to keep the program going as it is one of highly demanded services.
- 2 The department is also working with a program in New York on its web-based Deaf Depression Screener
- 3 research. GLAD staff is recruiting consumers to participate in the research.
- 4 The Pink Workout event was held October 11th with some participants which was understandable because
- 5 it was the first time ever held event. It is anticipated that there will be a larger number of participants next
- 6 year as the word gets out next time.
- 7 HUMAN SERVICES
- 8 Things are rolling smoothly in spite of losing two staff persons. GLAD is looking for someone to fill the
- 9 Legal Advocate position. The director of Human Services is overseeing LA's human services department
- including LA advocates, EDD manager, DAHC manager, and BGLAD.
- 11 TRI GLAD director is working closely with the CEO on DSS quarterly reports. The advocacy specialist in
- 12 LA is working closely with the CEO through the Director of Human Services on monthly e-stats for DSS
- 13 funded programs.
- 14 YACHT EVENT
- 15 GLAD managed to make a small profit of 10k. At least we did not lose funds at the event. Many
- 16 comments were very positive about the event which was great. If GLAD was to host another event on a
- 17 yacht, CEO has some second thoughts about it in spite of a wonderful review of the event.
- 18 A special announcement:
- Mozzeria Mobile Pizzeria Tour will be here at GLAD on this coming Monday, November 3rd from 11 am
- 20 to 2 pm. It is a great opportunity to taste their wonderful delicious pizza and to support a deaf owned
- business. The restaurant Mozzeria is based in San Francisco. The owners travelled from Florida to San
- 22 Francisco in the trolley making stops. GLAD was one of stops and it was a great opportunity for us here in
- 23 LA to feast on their pizza.
