APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Meeting of November 10, 2009 32 Page 3, Line 40 spell out "FMO" "For Males Only" 33 Sidansky moves to approve the minutes with corrections. Schultz abstains. Sutton Seconds. MSC. 34 35 **OFFICER'S REPORTS** III. 36 President's Report: 37 Kurs mentioned Hithe-Hultgren's email suggesting the possibility of having the Board Meeting on a different day of the week. Kurs suggested moving the Board Meetings to Saturdays mornings for a 38 breakfast meeting. Saturdays would be difficult for most Board Members as they have other obligations. 39 40 Perhaps Board Meetings could be moved to a different week day but not Saturdays. Hughes mentioned 41 that it may difficult to get interpreters as the interpreters for board meetings are already scheduled for the year. Sutton moves to change Board Meetings to the last Thursday of the month starting in June until the 42 43 Board Meeting needs to be changed again. Merryman seconds. All oppose. Motion failed. 44 Kurs is not able to go to the House of Blues (HOB) but encourages Board Members to attend or to make a donation. Sidansky will not be attending the HOB as he will be volunteering at the Strawberry Festival. 45 46 The site visit from The California Community Foundation (CCF) on March 29, 2010 went well. Kurs attended the site visit as CCF required one Board Member to be present. CCF wants GLAD to update 47 48 GLAD's Five Year Plan. The Five Year Plan has not been updated since 2003. We need to create a new 49 Five Year Plan with precise goals. Hughes said that CCF wants us to complete the Five Year Plan by November 2010. The grant is about \$37,000. Kurs would like to see an improvement in Board 50

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<u>Treasurer's Report:</u>

Schultz referred to the Controller's Report <u>as of today's date</u> was given to the finance committee with the following information -

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- Overall cash position today for DAHC, GLAD and LifeSigns is \$1,182,970.
- <u>Overall accounts receivable balance</u> is \$772,617 which comprised of <u>GLAD balance of \$288,247</u> and <u>LifeSigns balance of \$484,370</u>.
- Overall accounts payable is \$24,842.

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Financial reports <u>as of 3/31/10</u> was given to the finance committee presented by our controller with the following information –

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Consolidated profit and loss for year to date (<u>nine months ending 3/31/10</u>) shows <u>a profit of \$198,067</u> as compared to a <u>profit of \$93,379 a year ago</u>. The reason for our profit for the past seven months is due to the generous donation of \$150,000 from LACD for the for the new annex building.

- GLAD's year to date revenues as of 3/31/10 was \$2,894,548 which is \$37,449 more than prior year.
- <u>LifeSigns's year to date revenues as of 3/31/10</u> was \$1,859,651 which is \$89,930 more than prior year.
- GLAD's 3/31/10 aging accounts receivable balance was \$451,732 as compared to 1/31/10 balance of \$750,648.
- <u>LifeSigns's 3/31/10 aging accounts receivable balance</u> was \$516,935 as compared to 1/31/10 balance of \$457,834.

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31 32 The refinance for the GLAD building is finally completed with a 6.5 % interest rate.

Arce stated that it looks like GLAD's donations are up due to LACD's generous donation of \$150,000.

The Finance Committee discussed putting the \$150,000 into a restricted fund account.

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IV. CEO'S REPORT

- 38 This month is full of email flurry on 24/7 basis in regards to AB 2072. AB 2072 was passed in the
- 39 Assembly Health Committee. We tried to either make amendments to the bill or kill it. AB 2072 is to give
- 40 parents of deaf/hard of hearing babies' information on hearing loss. The problem with it is that it is one
- sided. Parents get information from audiologists who are not trained to discuss Language acquisition.
- 42 Audiologists usually recommend cochlear implants creating false hopes for parents into thinking that their
- babies would be cured. We want the Department of Education oversee this program and ensure that
- parents are receiving proper information so they can make informed decisions. We need to know how the
- state can be assured that the information being provided to parents is comprehensive, evidence-based,
- 46 unbiased, and accurate.

- 48 Background on this AB 2072 is that Assembly Member Mendoza from Norwalk representing some of OC
- 49 and LA was recruited by a group of organizations representing parents and schools who believe in oralism

and are vehemently against American Sign Language. Mendoza authored an amendment that favors this group without consulting with other stakeholders like us who have more experience in education for children who are deaf or hard of hearing.

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- I serve on the core group working on drafts and letters; thus, for the flurry of emails. There are 12
- 6 members on the core group and over 100 readers. Mendoza will meet with some stakeholders in
- 7 Sacramento on this coming Wednesday. Mendoza is interested in having a meeting for Southern
- 8 Californians; thus, I extended an invitation for him to use GLAD facility for the meeting and the tour, too.
- 9 Right now I am working with his deputy director in identifying a date to meet and hopefully here at
- GLAD. We will be uploading a new letter in our webpage for people to send letters to Assembly Members to kill the AB2072 if Mendoza continues refusing to make changes.

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We might have a meeting at OCDEAF and it was just decided today.

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GRANTS:

- City of Palmdale is recommending that we be awarded approximately \$14,000 instead of \$10,400. The council will meet and vote on May 5th
 - California Wellness will announce around June 18th
 - California Community Foundation will announce in June.
 - National Campaign the application is due June 1st or June 8th, it depends on which tier we choose to apply.
 - Employment Development Department application is due May 14th.

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Human Services

The Clothesline Project was a big success. We had over 40 T-shirts painted by community members expressing their feelings about domestic violence. We had information provided regarding types of violence and where one can go for help in both the written form, pictures, and through ASL DVDs.

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Hard of Hearing Program

We are receiving consumers and other service providers asking for information on low-cost hearing aids and repairs (sometimes due to Medi-Cal cuts).

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Parent Connections

We met with over 30 parents at Holy Angels Catholic Church.

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DAHC

Residents are asking for a donation of a treadmill or Body Flex Power for them to help improve their physical and spiritual well-being. It is very challenging to seek donations from companies.

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Employment Development Department

- It has been very challenging placing jobs in this economy. For example, last year Anaheim had 19
- 42 placements and as of March 31st, we had 4 placements.
- We sent EDD staff to different job fairs, recruitment fairs and referred some consumers to Department of Rehabilitation to take advantage of their OJT (On Job Training).

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46 Legal Cases

- 47 The challenge is getting the timeline of events that had taken place from the client. Also, to make sure the
- consumer answers the question asked. Our advocates work closely with consumers who need lawyers
- 49 preparing the case, timelines, and other fact findings, making it easier for the attorney to accept our cases.

1 It is not easy to find pro bono attorneys or attorneys who are willing to do it on contingency fees. 2 3 Health Education 4 Community Challenge Grant (CCG) exceeded the goal by having 123 students enrolled in an 8 hour 5 workshops in February. 51 students completed the entire program. 6 Ryan White: We started our 20th year of Ryan White CARE Act in March 2010. This program is to 7 8 provide interpreting services to different HIV/AIDS clinics that have clients who are deaf/hard of hearing. 9 10 Breast Cancer Komen: 6 month surveys collected: 42/40 (105% goal met) – completed 11 12 CBCRP: 12 month surveys collected: 161/200 (81% goal met) 13 14 Human Resources 15 As of April 23, we have 73 employees and one part time employee. We have 3 job openings which are: Community Interpreter – LA 16 Job Developer/Interpreter – Crenshaw 17 18 Community Advocate – Riverside 19 20 We will have 11 employees cover the Deaf Nation booth on May 1st. 21 22 Public Relations House of Blues – Sunday, May 16th 23 I am concerned because we are nearing May 16th and we sold 97 seats. We paid for 150 seats; however, 24 we can go up to 200 seats. It would be nice if more Board Members purchase tickets. 2 board members 25 26 have purchased tickets. Thank you. 27 28 Event flyers have been mailed. We are still seeking additional sponsors. Bob Hiltermann confirmed as the 29 event MC and Lexi Marman and Brian Michael Cole will perform a duet (song signed in ASL). 30 We are still looking for a celebrity. One celebrity expressed an interest; however, was called out of 31 country. Lupe Ontiveros is helping us recruit some of her friends. 32 33 House of Blues is supposed to be our biggest fund raiser event, so please make it happen. 34 35 Eyes of Deafness: photography by deaf and hard of hearing adults 36 Select prints from Eyes of Deafness exhibit will be featured at HOB event. 37 38 Vagina Monologues Vagina Monologues in ASL featuring an all Deaf Cast and voiced by hearing actresses and interpreters. 39 40 300 attended the show 41 230 attended the VIP after-party reception (people paid extra to attend this) 42 \$3,633 net profit 43 Thanks to 3 Board Members who attended the show and I hope they enjoyed the show. 44 Both afternoon and evening shows were sold out. The funds from Vagina Monologues went to GLAD's 45 domestic violence program. Possibly GLAD could have a show every two years. Sheree Devereaux (the

42 ADWAS (Abused Deaf Women's Advocacy Services)

43 We had sent two staff from the Riverside office and two staff from the Los Angeles office to ADWAS in 44 Seattle for an in depth training on domestic violence. Marylyn Smith, the directors of ADWAS, came last 45 week for a two day training. On the first day there was training for advocates and directors. The second 46 day there was a meeting with different agencies, shelters, including Peace Over Violence. The meeting 47 was very productive.
