- 32 D.S.S. being behind with paperwork. G.L.A.D. continues providing excellent services in spite of the
- inability to close the books.

- 3 questions and the need for references. The cost will be around \$7,000. G.L.A.D. needs to make the
- 4 intercom visually accessible to residents through V.P. (Videophone) or residents' smart phones to alert that
- 5 their "doorbell" is ringing outside, be able to chat through video and allow the visitors enter the building to
- 6 visit with residents. In the past, the intercom was based on analog (T.I.V.) and small T.V. in each
- 7 apartment. Parts are no longer available and we need to switch to digital.
