- 31 are expected to be filled by November. Community Advocate, Hal Sudderuth, is currently manning the
- office. Volunteers have been contacted to assist with clerical work. Discussion ensued. Jasmine has not sent a list of events for February yet. Will get clarification from her on pizza night in Ventura.
- 34 AAARP's annual tax preparation service, March-April, for low-income, deaf individuals is ending. United
- Way is now the vendor. Gary Jacobson (deaf accountant) has offered his services. Unsure whether services
- are free to program and/or participants. There are three accountants. Gary Jacobson will provide tax service on March 9<sup>th</sup> and April 4<sup>th</sup>. On March 21<sup>st</sup> an interpreter will be present for tax service.
- 38 Tri-County GLAD is considering a CERT Preparation event regarding earthquake readiness. Participants
- 39 will receive certification. CERT three-four hour refresher course will occur. Tests are used for new and past
- 40 participants to brush up on skills. Discussion ensued.
- 41 Aikins received recognition for becoming the new Board President on January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019. Discussion ensued.

- We are hoping to have four new board members at the next meeting.

The Royal Room holds 500 people and was preferred over the Banquet Hall as the lines of sight were not clear in the latter. The Board brainstormed on logistics of setting up the room as well as pricing.

- 22 \$250.00. There must be a minimum of eighty attendees if the price per person is to be \$51.67. The deposit
- is \$3,120. As you get closer to the date of the event, the price increases to \$4,132.60. With the admission of
- eighty people, we would break even from the \$4,133 and make a profit. Admission should be \$75 dollars.
- We have 80 people GLAD would profit \$1,866.00, plus there would be money left over from Tri-County
- 26 GLAD and the sponsors. For décor, we can purchase black and gold table cloths. One of the residents has
- offered to purchase red carpet for pictures. We also need to focus on what we have for awards and gift packages. Hughes can write a check tomorrow for the deposit if the Board votes and agrees. If it passes, we
- 29 can start on advertising. The date of the event is October 12, 2019 so the deadline should be ten days before.
- 30 Discussion ensued.
