Consolidated profit and loss for year to date (eleven months ending 5/31/12) shows a loss of \$(3,050) as compared to an income of \$133,533 a year ago.

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- Consolidated year to date revenues as of 5/31/12 was \$5,591,946 which is \$435,595 less than prior year.
- GLAD's 5/31/12 net loss was \$(80,257) as compared to prior year net loss of \$(736).
- LifeSigns's 5/31/12 net income was \$114,593 as compared to prior year net income of \$157,129.
- DAHC's 5/31/12 net loss was \$(37,386) as compared to prior year net loss of \$(20,129).

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#### IV. CEO'S REPORT

- Hughes reported that GLAD is in the last month of this fiscal year; however, most of the information
- below reflect the activities in the month of May.

- 22 HUMAN RESOURCES
- 23 We have a total of 73 employees. There are five full time staff interpreter job opportunities. We also have
- one Job Developer/Interpreter position opening.
- We have started on the Kaiser new plan as of June 1<sup>st</sup> and Flexible Spending Account (FSA) will start on
- July 1<sup>st</sup>. 39 employees are enrolled in 403b plan. 17 employees will enroll in dental insurance which is
- 27 non GLAD plan. We responded to staff's request to have dental insurance and we offered the option but
- will not contribute any funds to it.
- 29 PUBLIC RELATIONS
- We should be sending the HOB sponsorship brochure later this week. It is in the print shop as we got a
- 31 photo of Ken Paves last week. We have two sponsors confirmed which will take care of the rental fee.
- The GO Burger event on June 20<sup>th</sup> was a good turnout. There were approximately 10 people during lunch
- 33 hour and 60 people after work hours.
- West LA Church is interested in developing a relationship with GLAD and setting up a mentorship
- interpreter program. The church has a large deaf/hard of hearing audience.
- 36 The Annual Report has been completed and posted.
- 37 HUMAN SERVICES
- We will have our annual yard sale on July 7<sup>th</sup>.

- In spite of California being recognized as the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest unemployment state in the country, our hard
- working EDD staff managed to make some job placements. We made a total of 24 placements.
- 46 Hard of Hearing (HH) Program
- We had a HH/LD (late deafened) open house tech expo and we had over 54 in attendance, much better
- 48 compared to 3 last year.
- 49 Our HH specialist had an information booth on GLAD services for the Palmdale community and there

- 1 were over 100 attendees.
- 2 We plan to add two different caption telephones in our Visual Communication Center to educate people
- 3 who need telephones where they can continue using their voice and read captions through relay service.
- 4 We continue to have a successful online support group for hearing loss. May topics included frustration
- 5 due to missed social interaction in groups, CI surgery, captioning on news in TVs, calling 911 if an
- 6 emergency arises, discussions on local/internet news pieces featuring those with hearing loss. The average
- 7 number of participants is 93.
- 8 DAHC
- 9 All is fine. There are no vacancies. The residents had their first field trip using our van on May 5<sup>th</sup>.
- 10 HEALTH EDUCATION DEPARTMENT
- We started our Senior Tech Lab at GLAD on May 1<sup>st</sup>. We got an instructor (Independent contractor). She
- developed curriculum and provided presentations to groups where deaf/hoh senior citizens usually meet.
- Our first class will be on July 3<sup>rd</sup>. We received funding through California Communications Access
- 14 Foundation. We added the computer lab in the VCC.
- We received the Information and Education settlement fund and started preparations for the IE activities to
- 16 start July 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 17 Healthcare Access Case Management
- 18 A total of 23 appointments were conducted. This program is growing and is in high demand. We are
- making every effort to find replacement funds.
- We contacted four colleges to schedule HIV Prevention education program to start in the fall.
- 21 Since we are nearing the end of this fiscal year, Hughes is very confident that we will meet or exceed all
- 22 contract goals that end by June 30<sup>th</sup>.
- 23 Due to drastic reduction of hours from our Controller, it leads Hughes to work with our two accountants
- 24 more closely. We monitor budgets on a very frequent basis to make sure that we will exhaust funds by the
- 25 30<sup>th</sup>. We do keep Mike Michner in the loop. We are fortunate to have a highly talented pool of
- accountants.
