APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Meeting of June 29, 2011 Page 2, line 9-16, Revise the president's report to the first person. Kurs moves to approve the minutes with 30 corrections. Sidansky seconded. MSC. 31 32 33 **OFFICER'S REPORTS** III. 34 President's Report: 35 Schultz reported that Kurzet informed him that her term is up on the CODIE Advisory Board and that the CODIE Advisory Board informed Kurzet that she could not serve on two Boards. There was some 36 confusion among the Board Members because Sidansky and Jones serve on OCDEAF and Tri GLAD 37 Advisory Boards and then report to the GLAD Board. Sutton explained that since Kurzet is a 38 representative from the CODIE Advisory Board and attends GLAD Board Meetings and reports to the 39 40 GLAD Board on CODIE activities is in accord with the Bylaws. Kurzet will clarify the above to the 41 CODIE Advisory Board. Hughes explained that Lisa Price (Director of CODIE) had informed Hughes the CODIE Advisory Board had postponed electing new Members as they did not want to lose any Board 42 43 Members before Riverside's Deaf Awareness Week and that is the reason Kurzet kept coming to the 44 GLAD Board Meetings. The CODIE Board will meet after Riverside's Deaf Awareness Week to elect new Members. Schultz recommended that if Kurzet is interested in joining the GLAD Board she should 45 46 inform Lovitch then the Board could vote her in as a new Board Member. There will be a closed session after the Board Meeting. Next month Schultz will not attend the October 47 48 Board Meeting. Jones will run the October Board Meeting.

2 No Report

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- 4 Treasurer's Report:
- 5 The handout of Controller's Report as of today's date was given to the Finance Committee with the
- 6 following information -
- 7 Overall cash position today for DAHC, GLAD and LifeSigns is \$1,084,629.
- 8 Overall accounts receivable balance is \$1,140,185 which comprised of GLAD balance of \$588,601 and
- 9 LifeSigns balance of \$551,584.
- 10 Financial reports as of 8/31/11 was given to the Finance Committee presented by our controller with the
- 11 following information –
- 12 Consolidated profit and loss for year to date (two months ending 8/31/11) shows a loss of \$(36,452) as
- compared to a loss of \$(16,862) a year ago.
- 14 Consolidated year to date revenues as of 8/31/11 was \$940,467 which is \$16,182 less than prior year.
- 15 GLAD's 8/31/11 net loss was \$(44,898) as compared to prior year net loss of \$(16,476).
- LifeSigns's 8/31/11 net income was \$15,694 as compared to 25 prior year net income of \$2,780.
- DAHC's 8/31/11 net loss was \$(7,248) as compared to prior year net loss of \$(3,166).

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- 19 Secretary's Report:
- 20 Lovitch reported that all Members are present except Gomez and thanked the Board for reading the
- 21 minutes ahead of time. Sutton explained that if Kurzet's term has ended on the CODIE Advisory Board
- then they will need to send a new representative from CODIE the report to the GLAD Board.
- 23 Schultz stated that the late Etta Stecker's (former Board Vice President) memorial service was beautiful
- and Arce did a wonderful job interpreting.

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IV. CEO'S REPORT

- Hughes reported that GLAD had a nice event at the Los Angeles City Hall last Friday. LifeSigns was
- 28 recognized by the District 14 for its 26+years of service to the community. Congratulations to Stephen
- 29 Schultz, too for his recognition for his numerous volunteer activities. LifeSigns staff was so thrilled when
- 30 they learned that LifeSigns got the award. The LifeSigns staff voted to have it hung in the LifeSigns hall.
- 31 LifeSigns (LS)
- 32 Number of requests: 915
- 33 Cancellations: 127
- No Interpreter Available 9
- 35 Emergency 161
- 36 NIA Emergency 0
- 37 The search for LS director is still on; however for time being, Heidi Booth and I are managing LifeSigns. I
- am working on a possible restructure. Heidi is handling the staffing. I am handling all other issues related
- 39 to LifeSigns. I got to talk with many interpreters about their payroll, etc. I talked with vendors, too.
- 40 LifeSigns finally got paid for our services from a college worth \$84,000. I called their legal office and
- reminded them of their college's legal responsibilities in providing communication access which we
- 42 assisted in this. LifeSigns expected to be reimbursed for the services and threatened to send someone to sit
- in their office to wait for the check to be typed. They immediately got it done within a week (5 business
- 44 days).
- 45 The software is good but we do need upgrades in order to make it more customized for our needs. I am
- 46 currently discussing this with the LifeSigns Board.
- 47 LifeSigns will be sending 17 interpreters to the DEAFestival this Saturday along with a "point of contact"
- for interpreters to communicate with should they need to change positions, etc.
- 49 Hard of Hearing Program
- We have a new online Support Group for Hearing Loss facilitated by our hard of hearing specialist through

- 1 Face Book ("a place you can bring your hearing loss questions, offer and/or ask for support, advice,
- 2 inspiration, or just vent"). August topics included Personal Accommodations, Court Accommodations,
- 3 Communication at pools/beaches, hospital/doctor offices communication, etc. We had about 40-54
- 4 ongoing participants. We anticipate it will continue to grow.
- 5 Challenges:
- 6 Some hard of hearing consumers are struggling with how to communicate with their family and other
- 7 loved ones on their needs to use different communication means to accommodate their hearing loss. We
- 8 provide tools and peer counseling.
- 9 Advocacy Services
- 10 Independent Living Skills: A consumer was unable to pass the DMV written exam for two years since her
- license expired. She arranged to meet with an advocate on a weekly basis to review questions and
- 12 answers. After two months of weekly appointments, the consumer passed the written exam.
- We had SSI workshop last week and we had about 17 participants.
- 14 We also have Fall ASL classes September through November.
- 15 *B-GLAD*
- We have Janice England from Missouri as the new B-GLAD outreach coordinator.
- 17 Consumers were unable to use email or make videophone calls due to their personal budget constraints.
- 18 Numerous B-GLAD consumers lost internet access.
- 19 Success Stories:
- 20 An advocate provided information to Bakersfield Adult School on ADA's educational provisions for
- 21 schools to provide communication accommodation. A few days later, a consumer informed the advocate
- 22 that he was able to attend the Bakersfield Adult School as they will provide a sign language interpreter.
- 23 DAHC
- We completed a report of Tenant Income and Rent Certification and sent them to our third party
- 25 administrator, Community Housing Management Services (CHMS). CHMS communicate with the proper
- agencies on our behalf.
- 27 *EDD*
- 28 TRENDS:
- 29 A number of former consumers are returning back to us for services and an increase of Unemployment
- 30 Insurance assistance.
- 31 Through our cold call inquiries reveal that most employers are not hiring nor have any plans to hire on a
- 32 permanent basis. Seasonal hiring is about the same as last year; steady, but not strong, and some places are
- uncertain as to how many temp jobs they will be offering.
- I know that the current economy is making EDD jobs very difficult; however, I want to share a "happy"
- 35 story
- 36 A consumer gave up searching for a cooking position due to high competition here. However, GLAD-
- EDD sent the consumer cooking job leads. The consumer applied as a sous chef at a local resort. The
- 38 company liked the consumer very much and interviewed the consumer twice. The company unexpectedly
- 39 offered him a CHEF MANAGER position which oversees over 200 staff instead of the position as a sous
- 40 chef. The company is very pleased with our work and is committed to continue contacting us for more
- 41 referrals when needed.
- 42 HEALTH EDUCATION
- We developed two vlogs for our webpage, one to promote the upcoming AIDS Walk in October and the
- second to replace the current vlog on the HIV Prevention Program webpage. Program staff has
- 45 collaborated with GLAD-EDD staff to schedule community workshops at three EDD centers.
- 46 A mass mailing list for nationwide dissemination on our breast cancer DVDs and materials has been
- 47 developed.
- 48 HIV Prevention Program
- 49 Program staff is reviewing and revising the recruitment and retention strategy for our clients. Previous
- attempts have not generated satisfactory results yet. We are waiting for adult education programs to start

- so we can make different efforts to recruit clients so we can provide a community level workshop as
- 2 required by our contract.
- 3 HUMAN RESOURCES
- 4 We have 73 employees. We have three job opportunities:
- 5 LifeSigns Director
- 6 Community Interpreter
- 7 Regional Director –OCDEAF
- 8 PUBLIC RELATIONS
- 9 UrbanSak has officially teamed up with us in support of a nationwide Deaf Awareness. UrbanSak is a
- 10 convenient pouch that wraps around the wrist and is capable of carrying a cell phone, money, coins, credit
- cards, ID, keys, among many other items. UrbanSak is ideal for deaf and people who sign by providing
- access to a hands-free accessory while exercising, etc. Hughes owns two. UrbanSak can be purchased at
- our booth this Saturday or through our web. UrbanSak will donate 15% to GLAD driven sales back to
- support our programs and services.
- Mr. Bullet Leather Event raised \$870.00 in just a few hours at the Bullet Bar in North Hollywood. Thanks
- to Joey Tarin, Mr. Bullet Leather 2011 for choosing GLAD as the beneficiary.
- 17 Versa Effect Ticket Sales \$1 profit per ticket sold through walk in at receptionist's desk sold = \$25.00. We
- are working to make tickets available through our PayPal for future fundraising events.
- 19 Annual Campaign
- 20 GLAD is drafting a letter for Ken Paves and working on a donation card design.
- 21 DEAFestival
- 22 GLAD will have four booths at DEAFestival this coming Saturday. GLAD, EDD, LS, and Health Ed will
- share the four booths. There will be a comment box for people to write what they want from us, how we
- 24 can improve services, and an opportunity to express. It was like we did last year in lieu of Town Hall
- 25 Meeting. I was at the booth last year and not many people commented due to a very hot weather. We will
- 26 do it again this Saturday.
- 27 Flutters, Inc
- The GLAD design teal wristlet will be available for sale starting this Saturday at our booth.
- 29 The Championship Rounds
- 30 The Championship Rounds creative/producing team has decided to make it a feature film. The theme of
- our booth this Saturday will be boxing to start spreading the word about the Championship Rounds movie.
- 32 AIDSWALK Promotion
- 33 GLAD will participate in AIDSWALK Los Angeles as a team on October 16th. For being a part of the
- 34 Community Coalition Initiative (CCI) provided by AIDS Project Los Angeles, we have an opportunity to
- raise an additional \$5,000. AHF Pharmacy has made a generous gift of \$100,000 to support the CCI.
- 36 There are currently 23 organizations enrolled in the initiative. In addition to receiving 100% of all funds
- we raise as a team, the top 20 fundraising CCI teams at AIDS Walk Los Angeles 2011 will receive a bonus
- of \$5,000 from AHF Pharmacy. Top teams will be determined as one of the fundraising deadlines on
- 39 November 11th. It is important for us to participate and raise a high amount of dollars through sponsors
- 40 for individual walkers in order to get the additional \$5,000.
- 41 Jeffrey Young Memorial Fund
- 42 We have received \$2,630 as of 9/15/11.
- 43 *Misc*:
- Hughes, Richard Ray from City of LA, a representative from Braille Institute, and Jennifer Olson had a
- 45 meeting with two representatives from the deaf/blind community to discuss the lack of SSP programs
- among other issues. GLAD is looking into it to figure out where and which agency/grant to seek for
- 47 funding to pay for SSP.
- 48 We also had a meeting with various Department Of Rehabilitation representatives from local areas and
- 49 Sacramento to discuss GLAD providing services like vocational assessment and independent living skills
- 50 to get clients job ready for placement. The meeting was productive. Hughes is familiar with this program

- as Hughes worked in this field in one of her former employment. GLAD will need to do a financial
- 2 analysis because it is a for fee service and it is not a profit making program. We will meet again in
- 3 November.
- 4 Attorneys for the CNN lawsuit have filed their paperwork with the court and I had the opportunity to
- 5 review and am appalled by some of their comments. I am working with the Disability Rights Advocates
- 6 (our attorneys on this lawsuit) for comments.
- 7 The Coalition will meet in Fresno on October 19th.
- 8 We will have our quarterly staff meeting on October 13th.
- 9 Good news, the Board has its own email address, gladboard@gladinc.org. You will need to use www.
- Mailstreet.com. I will give instructions how to access to this through an email.
- 11 Lovitch would like to have the Board email address forwarded to one of his emails accounts.

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V. SUBSIDIARY REPORTS

LIFESIGNS Chair Report:

- 15 Arce reported that the LifeSigns Board discussed the LifeSigns online software Agenctrak1000 and the
- upgrades. The next LifeSigns Board meeting they will discuss the cost of the upgrades for Agenctrak1000.
- 17 Booth is assisting with running part of LifeSigns and is doing a wonderful job. Booth handles the
- 18 freelance interpreters and the staff. We are still looking for a LifeSigns Director.
- 19 LifeSigns is looking into setting up VRI which may help with eliminating NIA (No Interpreter Available)
- 20 and is still looking into hiring a consultant to market LifeSigns. Hughes explained that a hospital in
- 21 Riverside is considering VRI for emergency situations.

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DAHC Chair Report:

Hughes reported that some of the resident's old appliances needed to be replaced and that all of the residents are doing well.

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CODIE Report:

Kurzet reported that September 14th was her last day on the Advisory Board which was when the Board met. September 24th there will be a carbon monoxide workshop, the senior citizens meet every 4th Wednesday of the month, and November 11th and 12th will be the Mata Expo. Kurzet will find out from

31 the CODIE Advisory Board who will be the next representative to attend the GLAD Board Meetings.

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TRI COUNTY Report:

- 34 Sidansky reported that Tri has three new Board Members. Some of the Board Members had to step down
- 35 because according to the Bylaws a Board Member cannot serve more than ten years on the Tri GLAD
- 36 Advisory Board. There is a good mixture of younger and older people on the Board. There are nine
- Members on the Tri GLAD Advisory Board. Tri will host a fundraiser at Johnny Rockets on February 10, 2012.

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OC-DEAF Report:

- Jones informed the Board that the last time OCDEAF Advisory Board met was on September 9th. Ed
- Kelly is still assisting with a few things in the office. We lost another Board Member who moved to another state. However, we also gained a new hearing Board Member from Toyota who just joined the
- Board. Currently we have three deaf Board Members. We want to recruit more deaf Board Members. On
- 45 September 17th OCDEAF hosted Deaf Awareness Day at Knott's Berry Farm. We sold approximately 250
- 46 tickets and earned about \$500-\$600. 150 tickets were sold online. The event would have done better if
- 47 there was more time to advertise for the event. It was difficult to advertise the event because schools were
- 48 closed. The Deaf Awareness Day was moved to Knott's Berry Farm from Disneyland because the ticket
- cost for Disney was \$65 and Knott's Berry Farm was \$30.
- A thank you dinner was held at Chili's for Ed Kelly's last day working as Director of OCDEAF. Kelly

1 worked for OCDEAF and GLAD for fifteen and half years.

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VI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

4 Finance Committee Report:

Arce reported that Hughes received the audit report. The Finance Committee will receive the audit report highlights from Michner in about two weeks. Schultz will have an opportunity to review the audit report and provide feedback before he leaves on vacation.

Schultz informed the Board that the CEO evaluation is completed and that the Board will review it during the closed session.

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VII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

20 Five Year Plan

- 21 Hughes explained since DeMers retired and Kelly no longer working as Director at OCDEAF Hughes has
- taken over running LifeSigns and OCDEAF. Therefore Hughes has not been able to focus on the Five
- Year Plan and that she needs the Board's assistance with the Five Year Plan. Kurs and Hughes will work
- 24 together on the Five Year Plan.
- 25 Tracking Unfinished Business
- 26 Kurzet suggested that someone should keep track of the Unfinished Business section in the Board minutes
- 27 to keep track of the issues that need to be completed. Lovitch volunteered to keep track of the Unfinished
- 28 Business and he will begin with January 2012.
- 29 Domestic Violence
- Arce explained that sometimes there are no services for Deaf perpetrators. There was a court case where a
- 31 judge ordered the deaf perpetrator to go to counseling for a domestic violence case and pay for an
- 32 interpreter for their counseling sessions which is against ADA (American Disabilities Act). The deaf
- perpetrator should have been referred to GLAD.

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VIII. NEW BUSINESS

- Hughes informed the Board that the daughters of late Marcella Meyer (GLAD's former CEO) purchased a
- memory bench for Marcella Meyer and had it placed under a tree in by the water fountain. The Maucere family would like to do the same for one of their family member who is deceased. Discussion ensued.
- 39 Sidansky moves to establish an Adhoc Committee to develop guidelines for future GLAD memorials that
- 40 individuals want to place on the GLAD property. Kurs seconded. Open discussion. Kurs amends that
- 41 future memorials that individuals want to place on the GLAD property must be approved by the Board.
- Discussion ensued. Kurs withdrew his motion. Discussion closed. MSC. Sidansky will be responsible for
- 43 developing the memorial guidelines.
