We are wrapping up the 21-22 fiscal year. All DSS contract amendments submitted were denied

due to a change in the way that the contracts works this year. Instead, budget modifications will

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- be submitted before the end of the fiscal year. Dr. Hughes and regional directors are identifying areas that need budget modifications.
- The President asked whether the CA budget surplus would increase the DSS contract budget. Dr. Hughes and the CA Coalition of Agencies Serving Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCASDHH) had asked DSS the same question. DSS indicated because the contract term is five years the surplus would not increase the budget.
- Dr. Hughes will attend the NAD conference in Orlando, FL June 30 to July 4, 2022 DSS approved the flight expense because AB 1887 does not apply to nonprofit organizations. <sup>1</sup>Dr. Hughes is looking forward to the NAD conference. She will be visiting family for two weeks after the conference, but will be accessible for emergencies.
- GLAD won a grant from Rose Hill Foundation \$150,000 for two years (\$75,000 per year). The grant is limited to assistance with operations and COVID related issues. The grant cannot be used for building related expenses.
- Dr. Hughes is speaking with the District 14 representative to assist with payment for the building and retrofit. According to the order by the city of LA, if the order to retrofit is not completed the city will require the building be demolished.
- HUD, GLAD, and a third-party company, Genessy, will meet next week to determine what expenses can be covered by DAHC funds. The apartments are full and have a little over 40 people on the waiting list. Recently a tenant moved out, so a new tenant moved in. There is a definite need for more units.
- GLAD is partnering with beach safety officers to deploy the Beach Emergency Evacuation Lights System (BEELS). The Beach Emergency Evacuation Lights System, also known as BEELS, is a new beach evacuation alert system designed for all beachgoers, including those who are deaf or hard of hearing. During a beach evacuation, BEELS will flash white LED lights mounted on permanent structures and some lifeguard towers, as well as broadcast a siren and an audible evacuation alert in both English and Spanish. The alert message will change depending on the evacuation type, and the lights will flash slowly for a water-only evacuation and quickly for a full beach evacuation. GLAD advised that white lights would be hard to see. Alternative colors must not conflict with maritime and lifeguard rules.
- GLAD played a supportive role with getting LAUSD board to vote 100% to set up Deaf Education within LAUSD system.
- Karen asked about the current status of drug and alcohol programs for Deaf in LA. Dr. Hughes replied there are none, but it is desperately needed.
- GLAD will be an official voting center on June 7<sup>th</sup>. Voting will be hosted in the dining room on the first floor for staff, residents, and the community.
- LifeSigns board will meet June 1st. LifeSigns is switching to a different website developer with the goal of improving the LifeSigns webpage.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> AB 1887 prohibits a state agency, department, board or commission from requiring any state employees, officers, or members to travel to a state that, after June 26, 2015, has enacted a law that (1) has the effect of voiding or repealing existing state or local protections against discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression; (2) authorizes or requires discrimination against same-sex couples or their families or on the basis of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression; or (3) creates an exemption to antidiscrimination laws in order to permit discrimination against same-sex couples or their families or on the basis of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. (Gov. Code, § 11139.8, subds. (b)(1), (2).) In addition, the law prohibits California from approving a request for state-funded or state-sponsored travel to such a state. (Gov. Code, § 11139.8, subd. (b)(2).) The travel prohibition applies to state agencies, departments, boards, authorities, and commissions, including an agency, department, board, authority, or commission of the University of California, the Board of Regents of the University of California, and the California State University. (Gov. Code, § 11139.8, subd. (b).)

May 27<sup>th</sup> will be an outing to an Angel's baseball game. The theme that night is Star Wars bobble heads. They are thinking about hosting a fundraiser at Golden Brewery across from the Angels stadium.
