IV. CEO'S REPORT

Hughes reported that the conference team (five representatives each from the Assembly and the Senate) voted in favor of Assemblymember Mullin's request for 4.1 million dollars augmentation increase over a five year period for the Deaf Access Program (DAP). Last Friday, the vote was in our favor 9 to 1. The Senate and Assembly budget committees are scheduled to meet June 13th to review the 2018-2019 Budget Package of Bills. Then the bills will be sent to Senate and Assembly to vote to approve before June 15th. June 15th is the deadline for Legislature to pass the budget bill and send to the Governor. Number 64 is the augmentation regarding the 4.1 million dollars increase to our existing line item. Our strategy to get representatives to vote for line item number 64 worked. The CEO (Chief Executive Officer) has been working with agencies like NorCal (NorCal Center On Deafness, Sacramento), DCARA (Deaf Counseling Advocacy & Referral Agency, Bay Area), DHHSC (Deaf & Hard of Hearing Service Center, Fresno), and DSC (Deaf Community Services, San Diego) to communicate with our community members, and consumers to contact their elected representatives in their Sacramento offices. Senator Roth prefers hearing from people in the district office. The CEO instructed the CODIE regional director to create a vlog with a

- Challenges: Gas Prices have soared making it difficult for our consumers to buy gas for travel to EDD 6
- offices. Our EDD/GLAD staff presented consumers with different ways to get to the office using public 7
- transportation using with a TAP card that have discounted fares for people with disabilities. 8
- GLAD provided an in house training on the new laws for employment in California for all EDD/GLAD 9
- staff, community advocates, and regional directors. GLAD had an employment lawyer present the training. 10
- The two laws stood out were no employers can ask applicants about their previous salaries or if applicants 11
- had a criminal record. During the training staff asked the lawyer how to educate employers if these 12
- questions are still on application forms without harming consumers' interest in working for them. GLAD 13
- removed these two questions from our job application forms. On the GLAD application form, at the time 14
- of a job offer we make it clear that Livescans will be required. 15
- The Movie Event on June 9th was cancelled due to lack of interest. Only two tickets were purchased. 16
- GLAD will try again in fall after the MATA Expo. GLAD will have a huge booth at the Mata Expo and 17
- 18 flyers are be distributed to people stopping by our booth.
- 19 50th Anniversary
- There are two possible dates which will be discussed during new business. In 1969, the Greater Los 20
- Angeles Council for the Deaf was established. On April 14, 1971, GLAD was incorporated with bylaws. It 21
- is CEO's recommendation that GLAD use 1969 as the year when GLAD was established. 22
- 23 VRI

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- The board discussed their different experiences with doctor offices using an in person interpreter and a 24
- VRI interpreter. VRI is better for emergencies and an in-person interpreter is better for scheduled **25**
- appointments. Doctors must provide an in-person interpreter if requested. Discussion ensued. *2*6

29 LIFESIGNS (LS) Report:

- Woods reported that LS had a board meeting and discussed having four workshops annually. In the fall, 30
- there will be a CDI workshop. LS would like to collaborate with GLAD to co-host a conference for 31
- interpreters. Interpreters could earn four CEU's. The board is working on updating the bylaws. 32

DAHC Report:

- The CEO reported there are no vacancy's. Residents continue with their trips to two local grocery stores in 35 our van twice a month. There were several workshops hosted by DAHC like obtaining free smart phones
- 36 for low-income individuals. There was a huge response so DAHC scheduled more workshops to meet the 37
- high demand. 38
- GLAD's Information Technology staff is still researching to find a visual intercom system for residents to 39
- communicate with their visitors. One system was tested and it did not work. It was returned to the 40 manufacturer. There was flooding on the third floor due to a facet that was left on. We will be installing 41
 - motion sensor facets so the water will turn off once the residents are done using the sink.

CODIE Report:

No Report

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- map to show where the Senator Roth's district office is and encourage viewers to stop by the office to ask 1 them to vote for item number 64. Faxes, calls, and emails were used to contact Senator Roth's office. This 2 approach worked because Senator Roth voted in favor of the increase. GLAD (Greater Los Angeles 3 Agency on Deafness), OCDEAF (Orange County Deaf Equal Access Foundation), TCGLAD (Tri-County 4 5 GLAD), BGLAD (Bakersfield-GLAD), EDD, interpreters, and consumers used the same tactic to contact their local representatives at their local offices. With the increase in the budget, we will be required to 6 7 submit a revised budget proposals as well as the scope of work. 8
- The Disability Rights Center (DRC) developed the bill, which recommends placing a deaf/hh (hard of
- 9 hearing) case manager in each county's Child Protection Services (CPS), which is unrealistic. In
- Sacramento, we met with DSS (Department of Social Services) staff and DRC staff to inform them that the 10
- deaf agencies are opposed the bill due to the bill being written poorly and without the deaf community's 11
- input. A letter was sent to DSS with recommendations that the bill be tabled indefinitely and set up a task 12
- force consisting of the sister agencies representatives, DRC, and CPS to report back to the legislature in 13
- one year. As of now, the CEO has not received any updates on the bill. With the anticipation of budget cuts 14
- 15 starting July 2018, the CEO decided to cancel her trip to NAD (National Association of the Deaf)
- Conference saving the agency funds for staff's mileage travel reimbursement. The CEO worked closely 16
- with each director to ensure that contract goals are being met for June 30, 2018. The CEO and GLAD's 17
- subcontractor CPA (Certified Public Assistant) developed DAHC's (Deaf Affordable Housing 18
- Corporation) (Housing Urban Development-HUD) budget proposal for 2018-2019. The CEO worked 19
- closely with DD (Deputy Director) and TCGLAD regional director to work on budgets for 2018-2019. 20
