MINUTES: Accepted as read. 20 21 **OFFICERS REPORTS:** 22 President's Report: 23 Zoom will open at 6:00 pm for some informal chat. Meeting starts at 6:30 pm. Zoom stays on 15 minutes after 24 the close of meeting. 25 Agency passed the financial audit by the independent firm. 26 Ron Herbold reviewing agency Bylaws to have expectations set. 27 Discussed gathering at GLAD during the summer to discuss all ideas amongst the board. 28 Summarization and approval of our Five-Year Plan is not complete. Will discuss more at the summer meeting. 29 Secretary and Treasurer positions are still vacant. We are also looking for new people to join the board. 30 An election for the Officer of the Board will take place, currently it is Ron Herbold and Scott Hostetler. CEO's Report: 42 GLAD and all its agencies have increased in business, there are more fairs and booths that our agencies are 43 attending to provide more exposure. 44 GLAD had a successful career day with about 100-150 students in attendance. CODIE, OC-DEAF, and GLAD 45 were in attendance during this event. 46 GLAD and all its agencies had a successful Love & Literacy event. 47

Dr. Hughes has been constantly reviewing the budget before the 2024-2025 fiscal year ends. This will allow for

some funding to be put into reserves for next fiscal year.

Still waiting for EDD Job placement contract to be disseminated.

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- 1 The mental health program was set up in January, appointments have been filled. One full time and one part-
- 2 time employee was hired. There are 5 consumers a week for appointments during the week and weekends. Once
- 3 business increases then there can be an increase in how many consumers will be served.
- 4 There will be a big mental health event on June 14th, similar to the one GLAD had last year. Had the idea of
- 5 inviting the Vich family to do a presentation and attract more attention from the community. Booths and food
- 6 will be provided.
- 7 GLAD will receive the approval to continue mental health services after June.
- 8 Dr. Hughes will go to Sacramento to attend a conference with legislation in May. Plans to meet with DSS and
- 9 the new office of Deaf Accessibility directors, Spencer Montan.
- 10 Interpreter requests have increased since pre-COVID time. It has been a challenge to find more experienced,
- 11 qualified interpreters.
- 12 All workshops hosted at GLAD but are streamed online to provide better access for the community, at their own
- 13 convenience.
- 14 Started a Survey Project to develop appropriate language linguistic cultural questions for the regional center in
- 15 California. This will be for Deaf plus consumers, to get more information for the survey. Once approved, the
- state will use it statewide depending on the outcome of the survey.
- 17 Renovation of the roof is discussed due to recent heavy rain. The tiles on the roof will need to be replaced as
- there's been leaking within the building. The tiles have not been replaced since 1927. All renovations will
- 19 follow historical landmark appearance guidelines. The cost will be between \$55,000-\$75,000, GLAD has
- 20 building funds saved for these cases.
- 21 Discussion of the tree project has been put on hold as attention is focused on the roofing project.
- 22 Dr. Hughes plans to have a meeting with the Mayor of Los Angeles to discuss the retrofit for GLAD or there
 - could be a risk of loss of services. Needs to meet with the Mayor about getting the appropriate interpreters for press conferences as well.
- press conferences as well.
 Dr. Hughes urges CODIE, TRI-GLAD, and OC-DEAF to meet with their representatives for emergency
- 26 management.

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V. SUBSIDARY REPORTS:

- 30 LifeSigns -
 - LifeSigns has a full house.
 - Currently interviewing for a LifeSigns director.
 - Developing a list of interpreters that are qualified for press conferences due to community feedback.

DAHC -

- In house is very busy. Every month there is a different field trip taking place. Some locations are Venice Beach,
- 37 Botanical Gardens and Ventura fair. An interpreter will join the group, some residents invite their friends to join
- as well.
- 39 There will be movie days in the building.
- 40 Los Angeles Club for the Deaf (LACD) is partnering with us play "Being Michelle" and will also be holding a
- 41 panel discussion with the filmmakers.
- Partnered with LACD Wellness Workshop, April 3rd.
 - Trying to partner with others to provide events for the residents.

45 CODIE-

- Love and Literacy event was a success. There were 4 storytellers and 14 booths.
- 47 Pizza and snacks were provided by the Deaf Collaboration Advisory Network (DCAN) under Mental Health.
- 48 Additionally
- 49 Ice cream was sponsored by the Deaf Black Project.
- Animal masks made of felt, and animal flashlights were given to each child.

- 1 Two staff members reviewed the site certificate, and CODIE is site-certified to provide direct service (via ASL
- 2 access) assisting them with their tax returns. We have five ASL certified tax preparers.
- 3 Tax services on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. The last day is April 12th.
- Annual Mental Health Wellness hosted by RUBHS/CODIE in May. As soon as the committee decides the theme and date, it will be posted on the flyer.
- 6 May 10th CODIE is hosting a fundraising event with the Inland Empire 66ers/ San Manuel Stadium. Flyers will
- 7 be distributed as soon.
 - Sharon mentioned Ian Goldstein's passing, many in Riverside were emotional.

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TRI COUNTY

- Had a successful Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI)workshop on March 15th.
- On March 31st there will be a counseling service with a licensed counselor in attendance.
 - Will have ASL Literacy Event on April 5th at The Arc.
 - Will participate in Strawberry Festival Fundraiser in Ventura on May 17-18.
 - Still looking for members from Santa Barbara and Ventura County.

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OC DEAF:

- 18 There are 3 board members but will be recruiting more.
 - Still deciding who will be the OC-DEAF representative at Thursday meetings. There will be a decision soon.

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
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VII. ANNOUNCEMENTS:
