 - Overall cash position today for DAHC, GLAD and LifeSigns is \$1,197,444
 - Overall accounts receivable balance is \$786,440 which comprised of GLAD balance of \$318,168 and LifeSigns balance of \$486,272
 - Overall accounts payable is \$19,386

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Financial reports as of 4/30/10 was given to the finance committee presented by our controller with the following information-

Consolidated profit and loss for year to date (ten months ending 4/30/10) shows a profit of \$231,031 as compared to a profit of \$101,720 a year ago.

- GLAD's year to date revenues as of 4/30/10 was \$3,231,114 which is \$43,334 more than prior year
- LifeSigns's year to date revenues as of 4/30/10 was \$2,082,259 which is \$97,838 more than prior vear
- GLAD's 4/30/10 aging accounts receivable balance was \$511,126 as compared to 3/31/10 balance of \$451,732
- LifeSigns's 4/30/10 aging accounts receivable balance was \$537,656 as compared to 3/31/10 balance of \$516,935

HUMAN SERVICES

- We provided an in house training on domestic violence partnered with Abused Deaf Women Advocacy 41
- Services (ADWAS). 42
- 43 We also had Domestic Violence Services Provider Focus group. Service Providers in the LA community
- 44 which serve deaf and hard of hearing populations met to identify services for Domestic Violence which
- exist, and that those do not. We hope to continue this and collaborate with agencies that have "services". 45
- 46 Challenge:
- 47 Few attorneys offer their services at a pro bono or discounted rate; it is very difficult to get them to pay for
- 48 an interpreter for a meeting in their office.
- Many deaf consumers cannot afford to hire an attorney and when facing divorce or custody issues it can 49

- make the process that much more difficult for the deaf individual who is not familiar with the legal system thus can't effectively advocate for themselves.
- 3 It will be much easier if we have our own Law Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

6 Challenge: Looking for donations for a treadmill for residents. We are also looking for donations for food for the LUAU event.

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9 *EDD*

- 10 Trends: Job seekers are beginning to run out of UI benefits, or are on their final extensions. EDD staff
- refers them to SSA for SSI/SSDI, housing assistance through the City and County of Los Angeles, and
- 12 other agencies/means of surviving.
- 13 We had a successful event: Career Day Panel Discussion of past successful GLAD EDD clients/Marlton
- 14 School. Over 200 attended.
- 15 Some of our EDD offices have high caseloads that clients have to wait 2 to 3 weeks for appointments.
- 16 In our Rancho Cucamonga GLAD/EDD gave a formal presentation to VONS managers, more deaf/hard of
- hearing job seekers are starting to find jobs at VONS. The company would like to set up recruitment for
- deaf and hard of hearing job applicants in the near future.
- 19 We are doing something different, too. We had GLAD/EDD staff teach our clients how to use the train
- system when looking for work. Job seekers have broadened their search for jobs in different cities and
- 21 counties because GLAD/EDD showed them how to use the machine when paying for train tickets. They
- practiced on the train going to the Los Angeles Convention Center for the Latino for Hire Fair.

- 25 Teen Fest was a huge success with 93 middle and high school students attending. Surveys were sent to
- teachers for feedback.
- We will have Teen Health Fair on June 2nd at CA School for the Deaf Riverside.
- 28 Breast Cancer Prevention Research
- 29 19 women completed the 12- month survey in April. 183 women completed the 12 month survey by April
- 30 30th (goal was 199). Nine Participants are due for their 12-month survey in May.
- 31 All of our contracts that expire June 30th have been met except for the Teen Health Fair at CSDR. After it
- is done, our contract will be met with Information and Education grant.
